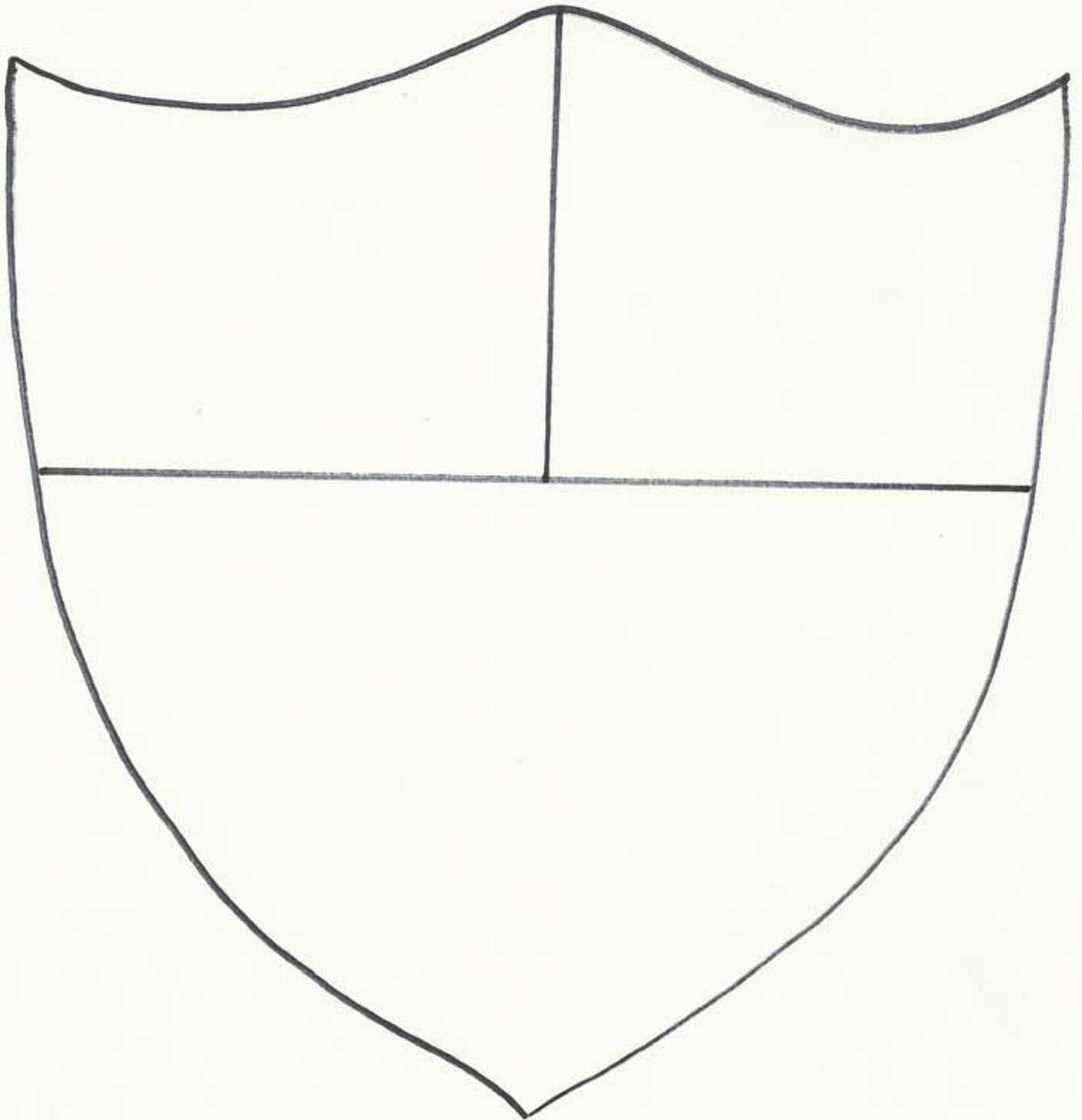

Choose a character from *Tod Comes Home* and create a shield for that character. First, choose a color that best represents the character. *S-T-R-E-T-C-H* your thinking by choosing a color that reflects the character's values, personality traits, actions, or goals rather than a concrete feature, such as *blue* for *blue eyes*. Fill in the upper left section of the shield with this color.

Next, choose a symbol that best represents the character. This symbol can be an object, an animal, a natural occurrence, etc. *S-T-R-E-T-C-H* your thinking by choosing a symbol that signifies an action by the character or his/her beliefs and values. For example, symbols for courage might be a lion, a sword, or an anchor. Put the symbol in the upper right section of the shield.

In the bottom section of the shield, draw an image of the character. This can be a picture of the character doing something from the story that shows the reasons for choosing the color and the symbol.
